CANDIDATES FOR DISCIPLESHIP

Luke 9:57-62

I. THE FIRST CANDIDATE

- A. Luke 9:57-58
 - **1.** He volunteered to follow, but the Lord discouraged him.
 - 2. Mark 4:16-17

He does not desire impetuous disciples, for they will fall away the quickest.

B. Luke 14:26-33

One must first evaluate the cost of commitment to God.

- 1. Matthew 10:21-22; John 16:1-4; 2nd Timothy 3:12

 Persecution should be expected.
- 2. Mark 10:17-22; Hebrews 11:24-26

 Christ must be valued more highly than riches.
- 3. Ecclesiastes 5:5; 2nd Peter 2:20-22; Hebrews 6:4-6

 It is preferable to never obey, than to do so without genuine commitment, for the punishment for apostasy is severe.

II. THE SECOND CANDIDATE

- A. Luke 9:59-60
 - **1.** He was invited by the Lord.
 - a. Matthew 11:28-30
 - b. Revelation 22:17
 - **2.** However, he delayed to accept the invitation, using an excuse.
 - a. Revelation 3:20
 He knocks.
 - b. Luke 14:16-24

We must answer!

B. Matthew 6:33

- **1.** His priorities were not the Lord's.
- 2. Matthew 10:37; 12:47-50

He elevated his family in the flesh to that position.

C. Acts 24:24-25

Like Felix, he thought it safe to delay.

1. James 4:13-14

However, life is unpredictable.

2. 2nd Corinthians 6:2

Salvation should be taken advantage of promptly!

III. THE THIRD CANDIDATE

A. Luke 9:61-62

He volunteered, but hesitated.

B. Luke 17:32; Genesis 19:26

Looking back is dangerous, and indicates a lack of commitment.

C. Philippians 3:13-14; 2nd Timothy 4:7

Christians are a forward looking people.
